Horse Owner First Aid *Dr. Amanda House, DACVIM UF Extension Veterinarian*

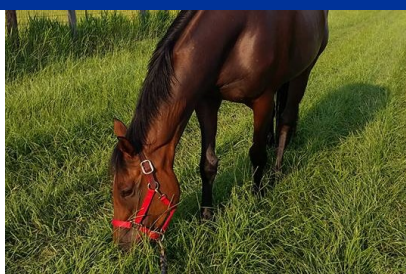
